- o CFATS program identifies and regulates high-risk chemical facilities to ensure they have security measures in place to reduce the risks associated with these chemicals.
- o Three inspectors in Ohio to provide site visits
- Program uses a dynamic multi-tiered risk assessment process and requires facilities identified as highrisk to meet and maintain performance-based security standards appropriate to the facilities and the risks they pose.
- Visiting locations 1-5 miles within Quicken Loans Arena to ensure facilities are preparing for upcoming RNC operations

• Management Subcommittee

- o Chief Sloan provided overview of upcoming RNC from local fire department perspective.
- o City of Cleveland is ready and prepared for RNC, but surrounding suburbs/counties and additional "softer" sites (outside of downtown) is a concern
- o Hazmat and technical rescue teams have been undergoing training and are prepared to respond, as needed
- o Suburban responders (fire and EMS) will not pre-deploy assets, but will respond as needed
- o In preparation for RNC, LEPC meeting in July was voted to be cancelled. Motion led by Sheldon Lustig, seconded by Bob Patton.
- o Management subcommittee did not meet, but they did approve four resolutions via email:

 - Resolution #05022016-6: Approving payment to PS Awards for retirement plaque

• Facilities Security and Accident Prevention Subcommittee

o Still working to develop a seminar on site security/cyber security/active shooter/workplace violence.

• Transportation Subcommittee

- O Held Rail Safety Seminar in April. Speakers were Sheldon Lustig, who spoke about railroad safety; a representative from Norfolk Southern Rail spoke about their response capabilities; and head of the Stark County Hazmat Team spoke about a minor train derailment they responded to in February 2016. Good turnout: 40-45 attendees from close to 20 agencies. Can potentially hold on a yearly basis.
- o There was a recent train derailment in Washington D.C. with 15 cars, 2 of which leaked a caustic substance.

• Spills Subcommittee

- o 8 facilities still need to submit reports: 3 have been referred to County Prosecutor's Office, and 5 others still need to submit their reports.
- Still attempting to work with Prosecutor's Office to resolve older spill issues and to redevelop Spills Matrix
- o In March and April, there were 8 reportable spills: 3 have submitted reports and are closed, 2 are past their reporting deadlines and will be sent letters reminding them to file reports, and 3 are not yet past their deadlines.

- Historical issue at a gas station in East Cleveland, with gas vapors being discovered/smelled at nearby houses. Will look into the issue.
- Ohio EPA had 3 instances of someone dumping chemicals in or next to a creek in Stark County, killing several thousand fish and covering 6 miles. Dover Dam was shut down in response as well. Ohio EPA is looking for leads on these instances.

• Emergency Preparedness and Response

- o Lt. Alan Finkelstein will be retiring in July from Strongsville FD, but will still stay involved with LEPC
- O Discussed the upcoming LEPC/hazmat full-scale exercise on Saturday, May 21, 2016 at the Cuyahoga Community College- East Campus in Highland Hills. Chagrin/Southeast Hazmat team is main players, with assistance from several local fire departments. Exercise will simulate a semi-truck accident releasing a chemical near the intersection of 271S and Harvard Ave (near Ahuja Hospital). The exercise will test 9 objectives, including activating the County Emergency Operations Center (EOC).
- Republic National Convention is coming soon, and many subcommittees are holding meeting for various disciplines.

• CCOEM Report

- o Justin Bechtel, Operations Manager, no longer with OEM
- Will give presentation at NEORSD's Regulatory Compliance Seminar on May 12 regarding LEPC Spill Reporting Requirements
- o Ad hoc GIS group met several times to discuss future of NEOCOP.
- o Rail re-routing letter discussed. Will send to Senator Sherrod Brown's office.
